


Overview


Livability is a term that refers to community quality of life as experienced by the people who live, work, and recreate there. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is undertaking the Rock Creek East I Livability Study to evaluate the transportation network in the study area from a system perspective and look for opportunities for a safer and more accessible multimodal network. As this area experiences growth in commercial activity the transportation network can benefit from infrastructure investment. Throughout the project, DDOT will work with members of the community and key stakeholders to identify specific opportunities to improve accommodations for people walking, biking, riding the bus, and driving.

Study Area

The Rock Creek East I study is defined by Rock Creek and the Maryland border to the West, Eastern Avenue to the North, New Hampshire Avenue NE and the Red Line Metrorail tracks to the East, and Military Road NW, Missouri Avenue NW, and Riggs Road NE to the South.



Process



Study Goals

At the end of the study, DDOT will provide recommendations such as:

- Enhanced pedestrian crossings
- Expanded bicycle and pedestrian connections
- Signage for better driver information
- Traffic calming in sensitive areas
- Safety improvements around public facilities such as schools and community centers
- Safety improvements at public transit facilities (i.e. bus stops)
